1. Welcome / Apologies/Matters Arising

GMK welcomed everyone. The Chair noted the apologies listed on Pg 7&8.

Minutes from the meeting on 27th February 2025 were agreed by consensus.

GMK reminded all present about completing a Declarations of interest, and if relevant Conflict of Interest documents. Both forms are available from the Board secretariat should anyone a copy.

HK confirmed response had been issued to Dr Tracey in relation to his correspondence about acute hospital provision in the area, and a meeting suggested, awaiting response.

DJ advised that Councillors could decide independently where they wish to vote – either the CFTF board or Council Meeting. Cllr R Watton stated he would be voting at Council meetings. Councillors to confirm at the next CFTF Board meeting of their individual decision on this matter.

Action: Elected Members to confirm their individual decision on where they will vote (CFTF Board or Council Chamber) by the next Board meeting in May.

2. | Plan for Neighbourhoods – Launch announcement

GMK advised that the anticipated prospectus had been received from the UK Government, hence the need for this meeting to be scheduled. He passed over to HK to provide an update on the new Plan for Neighbourhoods (PfN) guidance.

HK advised that Overarching Programme Goals were now:

- · Building thriving Places
- Strengthening communities
- · Taking back control

There is a focus on revitalising local areas, fighting deprivation, co-operative placemaking, not just about physical assets, it's about people taking collective action to improve their towns.

There is an increased list of investment interventions, and the original three were:

- Transport
- Safety & security
- Housing

The new additional interventions are:

- · Work, productivity and skills
- Cohesion
- Health & Well being
- Education & Opportunity

It was noted that as the updated prospectus applies to the whole of the UK, some elements of the new interventions will not fall within the remit of the Board, with other local community infrastructure in place already with a focus on a number of the interventions.

Confirmation has been received from a meeting with the MHCLG Policy representatives that there is no need to change the name from the Coleraine Future Town Fund (CFTF). The Board is responsible for co-producing the 10 Year Regeneration Plan, which constitutes a 10-year vision and 4-year investment plan, to improve the physical and social infrastructure of the local community. Partnership is integral to the successful delivery of the plan and the Board needs to consider how it will integrate and work alongside existing community infrastructure.

Action: Board to note key PfN important milestone dates below:

- 22 April 2025: CFTF Board confirm finalised membership and any proposals to alter their place boundaries.
- Spring 2025 to winter 2025: CFTF Board submit their Regeneration Plan to MHCLG for assessment and approval.
- From April 2026: Programme delivery funding released to local authorities, and delivery phase begins.

3. Establishing the CFTF Board

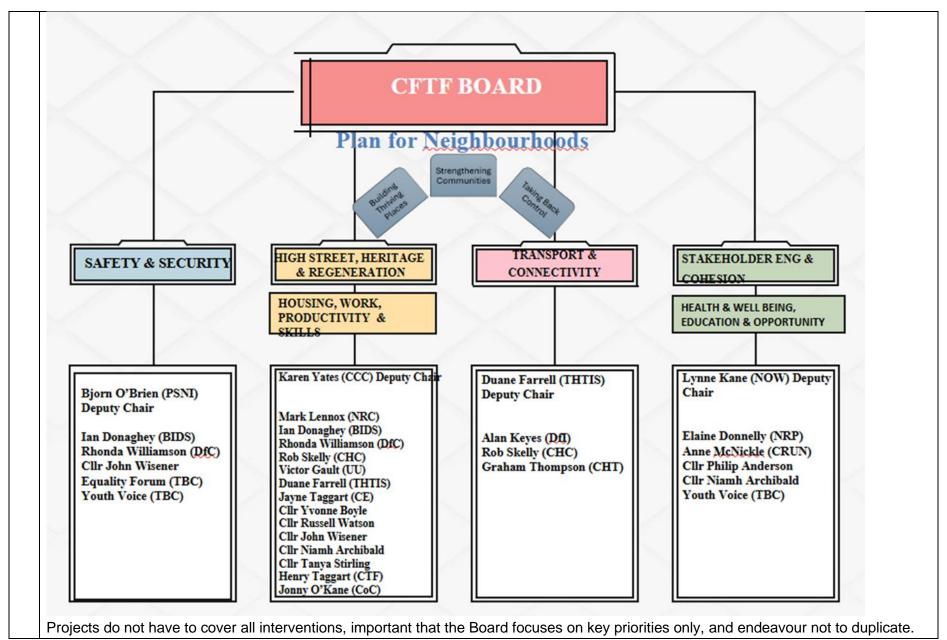
The new PfN programme guidance advised that the Board had an opportunity to review and refresh the skills, knowledge and expertise of the existing Board to see if any updates where required based on the updated programme requirements and wider list of interventions. The Council and the Chair (GMcK) reviewed the board and confirmed it does still fully reflect the requirements of the programme, therefore it was proposed that the CFTF Board membership does not change. This also includes the make-up of the four subgroups which will also be rolled into the new updated PfN programme.

Query from Councillor YB re inclusion of the Coleraine Multi-cultural Group in the CFTF. HK confirmed that this group would be invited to participate in the CFTF sub-groups.

Action:

It was agreed that the current make-up of the CFTF Board as the skills, knowledge and expertise of the existing members still meets the updated PfN guidance.

The four subgroups will be retained, and their remit updated to reflect programme objectives and additional PfN interventions.

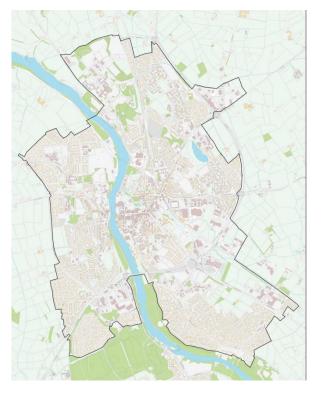


4a: CFTF Funding Boundary Map

GMcK advised that the new guidance requires a review of the Coleraine default funding boundary map provided by MHCLG. Effectively funding can only be spent on projects which fall within the boundary.

HK advised on the updated guidance from MHCLG on the funding boundary map:

- The data packs will be released in Spring 2025 and will assist places in building an evidence base. The data packs will, set out a suite of metrics linked to the three objectives of the programme intended to give places a strong starting evidence base. However, unlike last time, they are not intrinsically tied to the boundary process
- If places wish to request a change to the boundary, they should do so by providing a strong rationale and the MHCLG team will assess any request and approve/reject.
- Strongly advised not to take anything out of current boundary.
- If any changes to boundary map MHCLG will confirm made as soon as possible.
- Any changes to the boundary must be contiguous.
- Changes cannot incorporate another townland (population or settlement).
- Important to note that any changes to this boundary are not changes to the
 official town settlement boundary and are only regarded as boundary
 changes for purposes of this funding. Projects must align with current NAP
 designations for this area.



A proposal has been received from Mr R Skelly (Coleraine Harbour Commissioners) to include Mountsandel Fort & Wood, The Fish Passes and Lock gates at the Cutts and Somerset Forest.

Duane Farrell of The Honourable The Irish Society, declared a conflict of interest and did not take part in this discussion.

The rationale provided were as follows;

- Mountsandel Fort & Wood the significant heritage in Coleraine and an important green space that could be improved to the benefit of the whole town.
- The Fish Passes, Lock Gates at the Cutts this section is significant in heritage and its link to transport along the Lower Bann corridor as the last set of locks between Lough Neagh and the sea, and as the obvious place to install a crossing over the river should such a project be brought forward.
- Somerset Forest should be included as publicly owned green space- could be developed into a significant recreational and wellness resource for the town and people of Coleraine.

Inspector Bjorn O'Brien proposed that the Board should maximise the potential of the river and include The Cranagh area, Castleroe and the Cutts to maximise river frontage for tourism and growth options.

Discussion arose re some areas were outside the Coleraine DEA, and Officers confirmed they would review suggestions and investigate with the MHCLG policy team and update the Board at a further meeting which will be held online on the 10th April for the Board to approve any final updates to the map funding boundary.

Board members advised that suggested areas would maximise heritage, health & tourism potential area, and possibly increase leverage match funding.

Action – Council Officers to investigate suggested changes to the CFTF funding boundary map as proposed and report back at the next Board meeting which will be held on 10th April (via Teams).

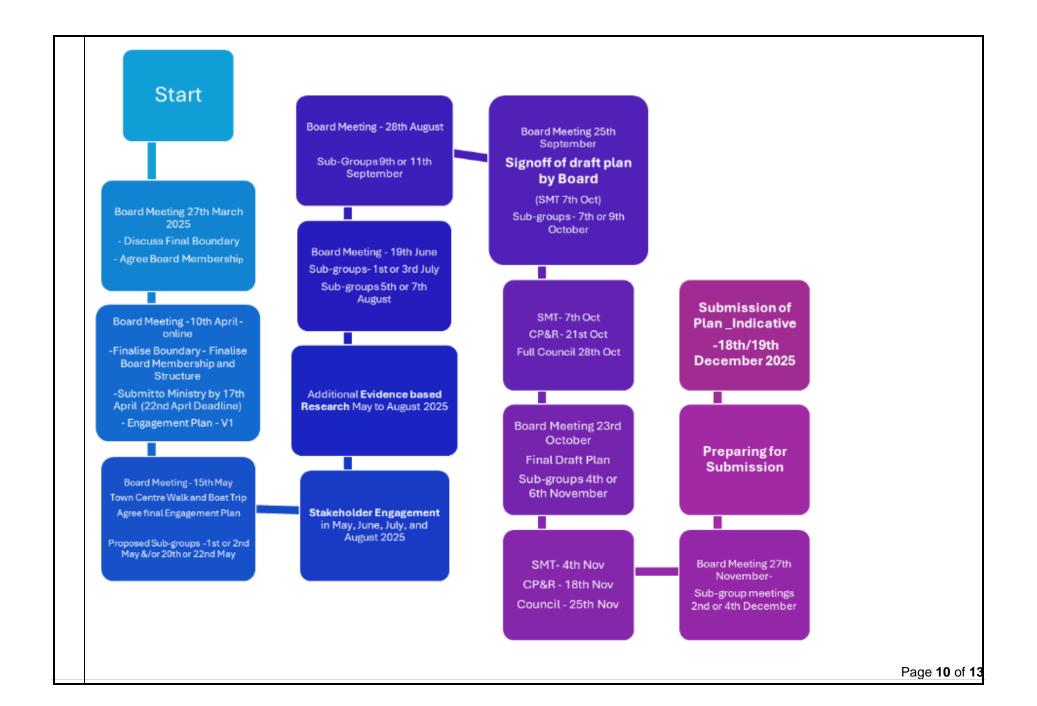
4b: CFTF Terms of Reference

5. Developing the Vision & 10 Year Investment Plan GMcK invited TH to provide an update on community engagement and draft delivery dates for delivery and submission of the Regeneration Plan. TH advised on the proposed timeline with submission date of Winter 2025 - Dec 2025 and provided the programme pathway below:



Discussion arose on pushing the date of submission to Feb /March 2025 as consultation phase is very ambitious. Consultation in July and August may be challenging, and many need to be extended into September and October may be required. The subgroups will help guide the consultation/engagement and will include focus groups, schools, businesses etc all voices to be heard.

The Board felt it would be better done right rather than being rushed so Feb/March 2026 was a more realistic timeframe, especially to accommodate engagement on a draft plan.

Action: Officers to review programme and make a request to MHCLG for a Feb/March 2026 submission date of the CFTF Regeneration Plan.

5b Communication Plan

GB advised that officers are still awaiting the brand guidelines, but hopefully they will be received in time for proposals to be brought forward at the May Board meeting. Pipeline communication activities will also be ready.
