CAUSEWAY COAST AND GLENS SUCCESS AT RECENT AWARDS

Causeway Coast and Glens Community Safety Partnership (PCSP) and Age Concern Causeway triumphed at the recent PSNI Problem-Solving awards for two innovative initiatives which are now being used across the Borough and beyond.

The PCSP Don't Worry be Appy project picked up 2nd place in the PSNI category of the awards. This online safety resource was developed by the PCSP in partnership with the Northern and Western Health and Social Care Trusts, NSPCC, PSNI and Education Authority.

The adaptable resource, which can be used as a series or as stand-alone lessons, covers five topics: Suicide, Mental Health and Self-esteem, Online Bullying, Gaming and Gambling, Sharing and receiving inappropriate images and where to go for support. The resource has been in use across the Borough for over a year now and has



received fantastic feedback from teachers and youth workers alike.

While it is nice to get recognition from awards like these, more importantly, they help promote these resources, ensuring that any school, community group or youth club facilitator who isn't already aware of them can get in touch and avail of this free resource to help keep young people safer online. Also recognised for its fantastic work was one of the PCSP small £999 recipients. Age Concern

Causeway won 3rd place in the community award for their first of its kind Dementia Safeguarding Scheme. The scheme encourages carers, family, and friends to provide useful information which can be used in the event of a person with dementia going missing or who needs assistance. Not only does this increase dementia awareness but reduces the risks for those living with dementia when out and about, it enables them to remain active members of the community and provides peace of mind for loved ones. Over the last few months, PCSP members have been acutely aware of the public feelings relating to personal safety. We as a partnership are always mindful that prevention is better than cure and have an action plan which aims to minimize crime and opportunities for crime. The balance is never easy with conflicting resource pressures. However we are proud to know from your feedback that our projects are helping you feel safer, such as:

1. Our crime prevention roadshows, member engagement and support of the COAST

safe home scheme and winter wellbeing events which have provided members of the public with essential safety equipment such as personal alarms.

- 2. Our educational programmes, such as building healthy relationships delivered by Women's Aid, Last Orders and our disability hate crime and cyber safety projects, which all aim to help encourage our younger citizens to: recognise the red flags of unhealthy relationships, challenge attitudes such as misogyny, encouraging everyone to be active bystanders and how to access support.
- 3. Our small £999 grants programme has enabled so many community groups and organisations to develop and deliver worthwhile projects which provide 'local solutions to local problems'.

One of these small grant applicants, we are proud to say, became a recipient of a PSNI Problem-Solving award (Community

Category) this year. Age Concern and partners picked up 3rd place for their Dementia wristbands. The PSCP couldn't be prouder to have supported this initiative and so many others that are making differences across the Causeway Coast and Glens and beyond.

Another successful initiative awarded 2nd place in the PCSP category of the PSNI Problem Solving Awards was our very own Don't Worry Be #appy Internet Safety project, so congratulations to our team and all the partners involved.

I believe in a world that can appear very frightening, it's important to remember to look for the good and I'm sure you will agree that there is a lot of good work happening.

ROMANCE SCAMS

Fraudsters can strike at any time of the year, and they don't care about gender, sexuality, age or race. They target everyone.

Cruelly, romance fraud is one of many ways criminals will seek to steal your money, which is why it's important you are aware of what signs to look out for to keep your money safe.

Chair of ScamwiseNI Partnership, Superintendent Joanne Gibson says: "Many people use social media and dating sites to find love and meet new people and, while in many cases, situations are safe and legitimate, there are, unfortunately, criminals who take advantage of this and go to great lengths to build a fake relationship. Their sole aim is stealing people's money.

"Fraudsters seek to build a relationship of trust quickly before requesting money. Initially, they'll appear charming and come across as being really interested in you, but they'll have multiple excuses for not being able to meet face-to-face. They'll hint at financial troubles and start asking for money to help them sort out their problems by playing on their emotions. For example, pay for medical or legal bills, help a family member or to help pay for travel, or some sort of investment opportunity. They'll promise to repay the money, but have no intention of doing so.

"This is a despicable type of crime which, we believe, is under-reported because people feel embarrassed. We hope by raising awareness of this type of fraud, people will know the signs to look out for and feel empowered to stop fraudsters taking their money. We also encourage anyone who has lost money in this type of fraud to report it. Do not feel ashamed - help and support is available."

Stay safe online

Stay on the app - Always keep communication on the dating website or app you're using. Many have inbuilt security and assistance.



They also take steps to remove and ban fake accounts so you're safer there. Fraudsters will also try to get you to chat or text away from the dating site or app you first met them on. This allows them to keep in contact if their profile is deleted for being fake.

Check their socials - Carry out your own research on the person, checking their social media presence to see if it matches what's on the dating site. Looking at key details such as name, location and family members can help identify inconsistencies in what you have been told.

Check their photo - Profile pictures can be deceiving and be taken from anywhere on the internet. You can use various websites to check photos using a reverse image search to prove if the photo is valid.

If you're looking for friendship, companionship or love online, it should never start with being asked for money and, if it does, it's not a friend or relationship worth having.
