Holocaust Memorial Day 2024

Causeway Coast and Glens Borough Council's Good Relations Team marked Holocaust Memorial Day this year with an online exhibition.

Holocaust Memorial Day takes place on January 27th each year, coinciding with the anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau, the largest Nazi death camp. It is a time to remember the millions of people murdered during the Holocaust, under Nazi Persecution and in the genocides which followed in Cambodia, Rwanda, Bosnia and Darfur.

The theme for this year was *Fragility of Freedom*. In every genocide that has taken place, those who are targeted for persecution have first had their freedoms restricted and removed, before many of them are murdered. This is often a subtle, slow process.

Despite this, in every genocide there are those who risk their own freedom to help others and this is the theme of the current "One Life" film which tells the story of Sir Nicholas Winton and the 669 children that he rescued in the months leading up to World War II.

The online exhibition includes a "Timeline of Nazi Germany" which gives a year-by-year account of how freedoms were gradually restricted and removed from the Jewish people from 1933 onwards, long before

the start of the second world war. It is a sobering reminder of where the mistreatment of whole groups of people can ultimately take us. This and other materials can still be viewed here:

Building a United Community Grant Scheme

Up to £1,500 funding is available through the "**Building a United Community Fund**" which is Council's Good Relations grant scheme. The fund has been designed to support, promote and develop Good Relations projects throughout the borough and is currently open for applications for projects taking place between April 2024 and Feb 2025.

Examples of previously funded projects include:

- **Building Relationships & Embracing Change** - young people engaging in Good Relations workshops to explore each other's cultures, values & beliefs, including first hand experiences of the Troubles.
- **Learning Language together** – a series of workshops exploring the language and traditions of one particular culture as part of the shared heritage in our community.
- **Different Beats, Same Heart** – a programme of musical workshops where participants learn about different instruments and the role they play in different, yet similar, communities.
- **Bringing the Community Together** – a series of multisport workshops for young people as a way of exploring sports that make up part of our cultural heritage.







January – March Arts Guides Out Now

Causeway Coast and Glens Arts Services is delighted to unveil an exciting lineup of cultural events and activities at Roe Valley Arts and Cultural Centre and Flowerfield Arts Centre for January – March 2024.

At Flowerfield, visitors can explore the Hidden Creativity exhibition (6 Jan – 24 Feb), by students from North West Regional College and from 9 March – 20 April "First They Ignore You," an exhibition by Sheila Chakravariti, curated by Belfast Exposed. Live music enthusiasts will be treated to performances by The Breath (24 Feb) and Réalta featuring Myles McCormack (16 Mar).



Flowerfield offers a range of creative opportunities for young people starting at age 5. For adults there are workshops in pottery, fused glass and painting alongside T'ai chi, and Irish & Scottish céilí/cèilidh dancing.

Roe Valley Arts Centre kicks off the season with the brilliant exhibition "Brumous" by award-winning artist Aidan Crotty (12 Jan – 16 Feb). The centre is delighted to partner once again with Live Music Now light music and lunch concerts for local senior citizens, plus there will be live music by Nodlaig Ní Bhrollaigh and guest musicians (23 March), and comedian Neil Delamere returns on 11 April.

February brings back the brilliant Steinbeck Festival, featuring exhibitions, talks, and a packed programme of activities, including an evening with local poets and storytellers. Mark Carruthers will be in conversation with former BBC political journalist and author Stephen Walker, as part of a talk entitled 'John Hume - The Persuader'.

At February Half Term there will be 2 family film screenings as part of Cinemagic's Young Audiences Supporting Foodbanks Initiative. Flowerfield will screen "Pete's Dragon" (10 Feb), and Roe Valley will screen "The Good Dinosaur" (17 Feb). Advance booking is required but rather than paying for a ticket to gain entry to the screening you are asked to donate essential foodbank items on the day.

POLICING AND COMMUNITY SAFETY PARTNERSHIP (PCSP)

The PCSP Small Grants Programme 2023-24

The PCSP Small Grants Programme 2023-24 is open for applications.

The PCSP small grants programme has been developed to provide organisations with up to a £999 grant to organise a project or event that will help prevent, reduce, address crime and help people feel safer in their own communities.

Grants of up to £999 are available towards eligible costs and groups may be limited to one successful.

PCSP grant application per year depending upon the level of demand.

Organisations must be from within or operating within the Causeway Coast and Glens Borough Council area. For the purposes of this programme, only formally constituted organisations which are not-for-profit that are open, accountable and representative of the geographical area which they service and which promote and enhance Community Safety can apply. Such as Community and Voluntary organisations within Causeway Coast and Glens Borough. Please note NI wide groups can partnership with local groups to apply for this grant.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Council's Social Connections Grant is still open for applications!



This programme will provide small grants of £500 for projects that address loneliness and isolation and build social connections.

You might be operating a Warm Space scheme, or planning an arts and craft programme or a community growing project or yoga classes and could apply for the grant towards the costs of venue hire, transport, refreshments, tutors or materials.

We want to fund projects that:

- create more opportunities to bring people together to make connections doing something they enjoy;
- help to reduce the social isolation that can be a result of experiencing financial difficulties;
- enable local activities to become more accessible.

You might be operating a Warm Space scheme, or planning an arts and craft programme or a community growing project or yoga classes and could apply for the grant towards the costs of venue hire, transport, refreshments, tutors or materials.

This is a rolling grant programme for activity from 1st April onwards and applications will be assessed on a regular basis within 3 weeks of applying.

Causeway Coast and Glens Borough Council excited to announce its £6million PEACEPLUS bid

The Causeway Coast and Glens Borough Council PEACEPLUS Partnership are excited to announce that their £6 million Co-Designed Local Action Plan Bid was submitted to the Special European Programmes Body on 14th December 2023.

PEACEPLUS is a new cross-border funding Programme supported by the European Union, the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Government of Ireland, and the Northern Ireland administration.

“The submission of the Co-Designed Local Action Plan has been meticulously planned and considered, coming after what has been a year long process of consultation within the wider Community, including a large number of individual and collective stakeholders within the Causeway Coast and Glens Borough Council area. We, as a Partnership are extremely grateful for each and every individual contribution, which has now brought this plan to fruition” commented Chair of the PEACEPLUS Partnership, Cllr Ciarán McQuillan. Cllr McQuillan went on to pay tribute to the PEACEPLUS Partnership acknowledging “the hard work, effort and commitment that each and every Partner had brought to the table during the Consultation period, in particular, we are indebted to the pragmatic and advisory approach that so many of our Partners took on this journey.”

The PEACEPLUS Programme is divided into six themes and twenty-two investment areas. The Council's submission is under Investment Area 1.1 Co-designed Local Community Peace Action Plans and will focus on three thematic areas to include:

- **Local Community Regeneration & Transformation** (e.g., Development of shared outdoor spaces which enables increased levels of cross community interaction and where possible, capitalise upon natural assets; Development of co-designed cross -community place making plans)
 - **Building Thriving & Peaceful Communities** (e.g., Programmes designed to build the capacity of local organisations through cross community collaboration, Community action projects designed to provide additional activity and services in key areas such as education, health and wellbeing and the environment)
 - **Celebrating Cultural Expression** (e.g., Programmes which build, improve, and sustain relationships between and within communities by addressing issues of trust, prejudice and intolerance)
- In total, a series of 23 Programmes will be delivered, meeting the needs (as identified by the Community Consultation) of a wide range of communities, individuals, and organisations throughout the Borough.
