Good Relations Week is supported by The Executive Office and contributes to delivering the Together: Building a United Community Strategy.




The Boyds of Ballycastle and Beyond

Ramoan Parish Centre, Ballycastle, 19th September at 7.30pm

As part of our ongoing Ballycastle Museum redevelopment project supported by The National Heritage Lottery Fund, join Jonathan Gray and Adrian Boyd for a free public talk exploring the history of the Boyd family.

What started four years ago as an innocent investigation into Adrian Boyd's family tree took Adrian and Jonathan on a remarkable journey that has spanned 700 years of local and international history, unearthing documentary sources from La Rochelle in France to the island of St Kitts in the Caribbean, from South Carolina in the USA to Ballycastle, Co Antrim and from Waterford in Ireland to West Kilbride in Scotland. Now with an archive of over 6000 images and documents it is time to pass this research on to future generations revealing the remarkable story of an Ayrshire family who have left their mark on history, and who's descendants still live today.

'Chronicling 180 Years' Exhibition Launch

Coleraine Chronicle was first published in April 1844 and this exhibition showcases the place this weekly publication has held in the community for 180 years. In addition to bringing the news to local people, The Chronicle has recorded civic, social, sporting, business and farming life across the borough, and we'll be sharing hundreds of photographs captured by the paper's photographers over the years.

Limavady football Down the Years' exhibition features a selection of photographs from Limavady author, Gerry Robinson's recent book by the same title. Gerry developed this book to raise funds after hearing of a local woman requiring experimental treatment for cancer.

This free exhibition will display photographs of football players and teams in the Limavady area.

Coinciding with this exhibition is the Supercup NI, Premier Winners 2023 trophy and memorabilia now on permanent display within our new gallery space at The Roe Valley Arts & Cultural Centre.

The Nelson McGonagle Digital Archive

Now on display within our new gallery space at the Roe Valley Arts & Cultural Centre is a **Nelson McGonagle Digital Archive** where visitors can view Nelson's previous four publications which are now out of publication. Local historian, Nelson McGonagle has collected an array of images over many years, all chronicling the life and times of days gone by in Limavady and the Roe Valley.

The photos provide an interesting window onto the past and themes include sport social interaction and farming and street views, creating a fascinating insight into the history of Limavady and the Roe Valley, while highlighting interesting local characters from the 19th through to the 20th centuries. Outstanding success was achieved with the publication of Nelson's last four volumes. These were packed with nostalgic photographs and poetry and raised £16,000 for charities thanks to the generosity of local residents

It is hoped his fifth volume will have the same success, with all proceeds from this book going towards supporting Age Concern Causeway and Limavady Initiative for the Prevention of Suicide (LIPS).

Nelson's fifth and final book in his series, entitled 'Limavady and the Roe Valley – Sporting and Social Life' is available to buy through the Roe Valley Arts & Cultural Centre and is priced at £10.



PCSP

999 Policing and Community Safety Grant 2024-2025



The current small PCSP grant is Live and Open to receive applications until 31st March 2025 or whenever grant funds are exhausted. The grant award offers the maximum grant of £999 and is available towards eligible costs.

The PCSP small grants programme has been developed to provide organisations with up to a £999 grant to organise a project or event that will help prevent, reduce, address crime and help people feel safer in their own communities.

Grants are now operated from a new Grant Hub that the Funding unit use to administer ALL GRANTS on behalf of council. It is pretty simple to register. In the first instance, just register for an account at Apply - Grant Hub - Causeway Coast and Glens Borough Council (ccgbcapps.com)

Once you register, you will be given a username and password, once this is setup you can apply for any open grant. It is now all done online.

Drugs Bins

Causeway Coast and Glens Policing and Community Safety Partnership (PCSP) Rapid Drug Bins

The RAPID initiative, (Remove All Prescription and Illegal Drugs), aims to remove prescription and illegal drugs from our streets and ultimately make the Borough a safer place.

The PCSP and the PSNI have collaborated with the Public Health Agency (PHA) and the local Drug and Alcohol Coordination Team (DACT) to work with communities who could benefit from the scheme. The bins are located at Causeway Rural and Urban Network (CRUN) in Coleraine and Limavady Community Development Initiative (LCDI), with further areas also being explored.

Following a recent clean out of the Causeway bins, a large number of prescribed medications and some illegal drugs were removed from our streets and disposed of.

Since 2010, over 100,000 tablets have been deposited in Belfast RAPID bins alone. Prescription or over-the-counter medication makes up 90% of the contents but illegal drugs have also been deposited.
