Did you know?

■ In 2024, Northern Ireland recycled or reused 50% of waste materials but we need to do more to achieve the 65% target by 2035.

■ Household Recycling Centres (HRCs) enable residents to reuse and recycle materials, reducing the amount of waste sent to landfill.

Recycling offers significant benefits

■ It protects the environment by reducing waste, conserving resources, saving energy, and cutting greenhouse gas emissions, helping to combat climate change and lower Northern Ireland's carbon footprint.

■ It reduces landfill costs.

■ Supports the local economy and creates jobs.

■ Supplies essential materials like paper, glass and plastic to businesses in Northern Ireland.



AIMING FOR 65% RECYCLING BY 2035

What this means for you

■ All visitors must pre-sort household waste for reuse and recycling.

■ Site staff will guide you in using the correct containers and may ask to check bags to ensure no recyclables end up in general waste skips.

■ Keep this guide for information on materials that can be recycled at your local HRC.



What you need to do when visiting your Household Recycling Centre

To make your visit to the HRC as quick and easy as possible, please follow these simple steps:



Sort your waste at home - Separate recyclable materials and waste before you leave. Remember, recyclable items are not allowed in general waste skips.



Organise your vehicle - Arrange your recyclable materials and waste in your vehicle so you can easily unload items into the correct containers when you arrive.



Reuse when possible - For bulky items like furniture, electrical appliances and bicycles, check if they can be reused. Look out for the relevant containers.



Talk to our staff - If you're unsure about what can or cannot be recycled, talk to our staff. They are happy to help and advise you on which container to use.

What can be recycled?

A wide range of materials can be recycled at your HRC.
