ADULT SOCIAL PRESCRIBING.

The Programme will deliver the benefits of Social Prescribing by supporting individuals deemed to be in Tier 1 & 2 mental health needs and other health-related issues and carers.

The Programme will contribute towards building personal confidence and resilience, encouraging, and supporting the individual to take strength and heart from socialisation, building and strengthening their social networks, by taking action on their own behalf for their own benefit.



The Programme will examine the best forms of communication to use in order to involve those who are hardest to reach and are considered to fall under Tier 1 (early presentation of problems or distress) and Tier 2 (mild to moderate presentation) mental health needs, and builds best practice, promotes positive mental wellbeing and can accurately prescribe social activities.


The programme will also look to develop relationships and support people to share with others their own journey of discovery and personal development for both beneficiaries and practitioners.

THE PARTNERSHIP



This partnership has a vested interest in the capital project at Mountsandel, and will be visiting it as part of their June Partnership meeting to learn how local awareness can be raised about the symbolic and significant nature of the site, the history and heritage that surrounds it, and our interaction with that environment, so that we as a local community can learn to shine a spotlight on it and the surrounding Bann area.



Mountsandel Wood contains one of the earliest known settlements of humans on the island of Ireland dating to between 7600 and 7900BC, where Stone Age hunters camped here to fish salmon in the natural weir. The earthen fort is built with an imposing command of the river and is thought to date back to Anglo-Norman times. The enticing forest walk leads from the fort down to the banks of the Bann and passes close to the weir at The Cutts giving panoramic views over Somerset Wood and of the River Bann.
