**Question 16:** Would you say relations between Protestants and Catholics are better now than they were 5 years ago, worse or about the same now as then?

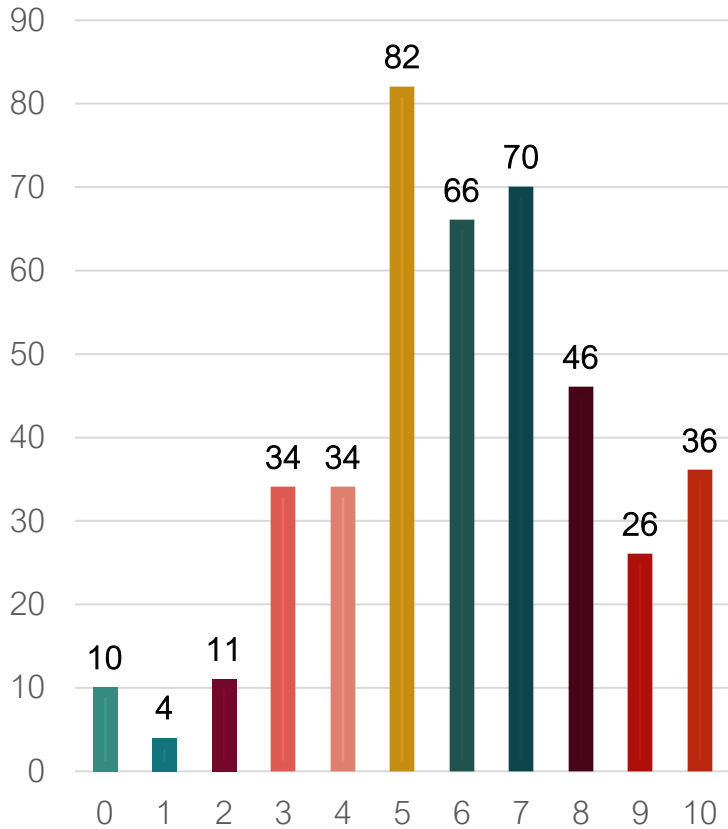


**Question 17:** Do you think relations between Protestants and Catholics in 5 years' time will be better than now, worse than now or about the same as now?



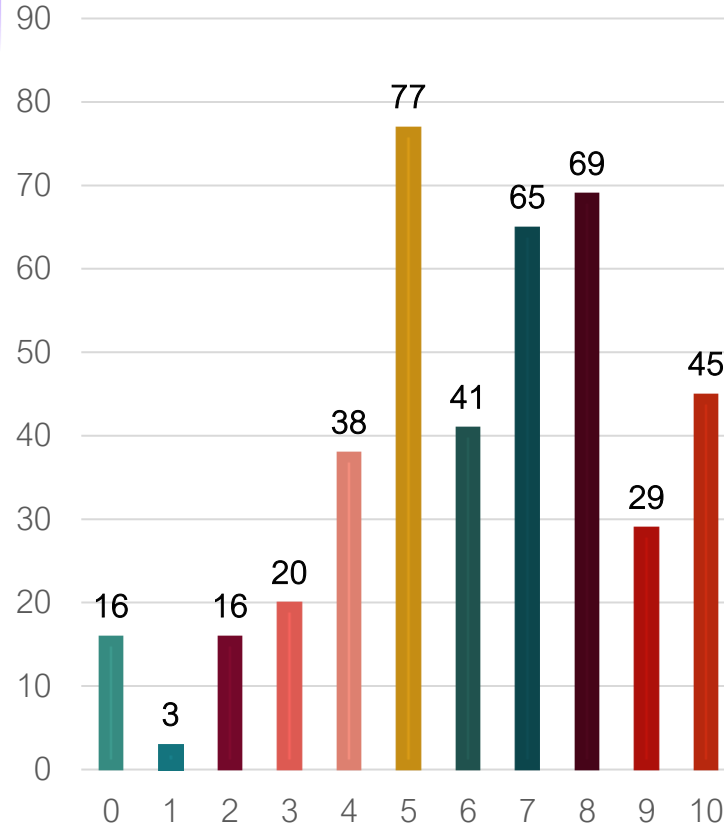

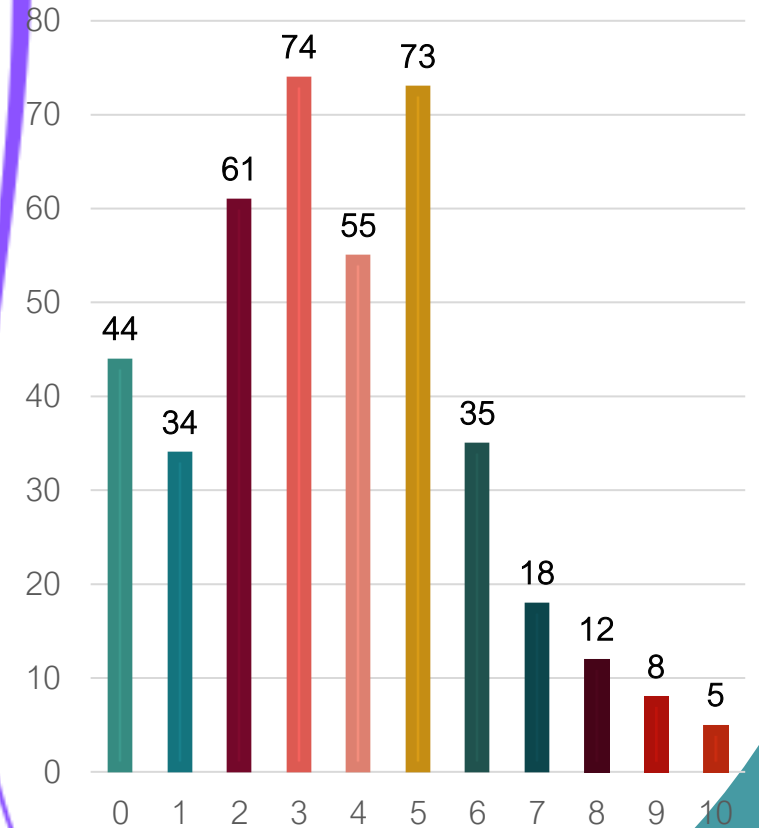

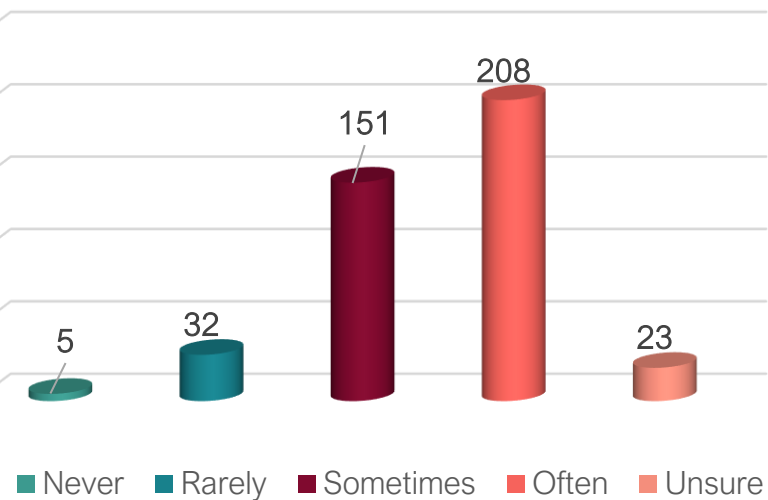

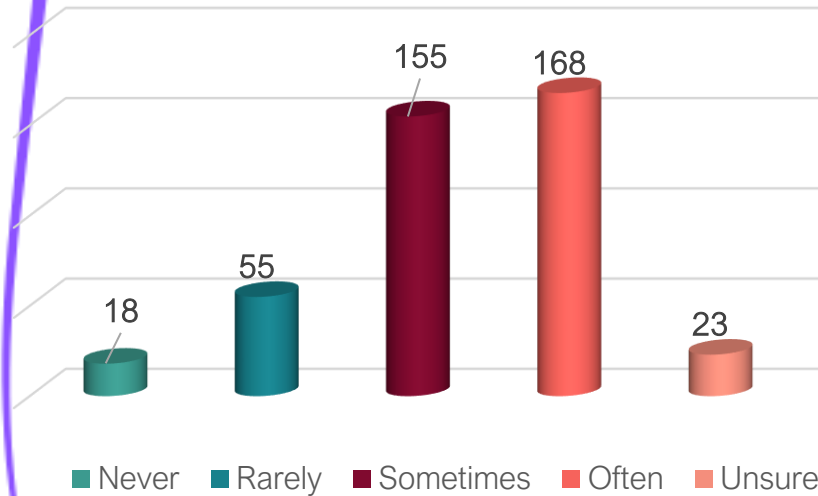

- Up to now, how often have you been in contact with people from a different religious, community or ethnic background to yourself?



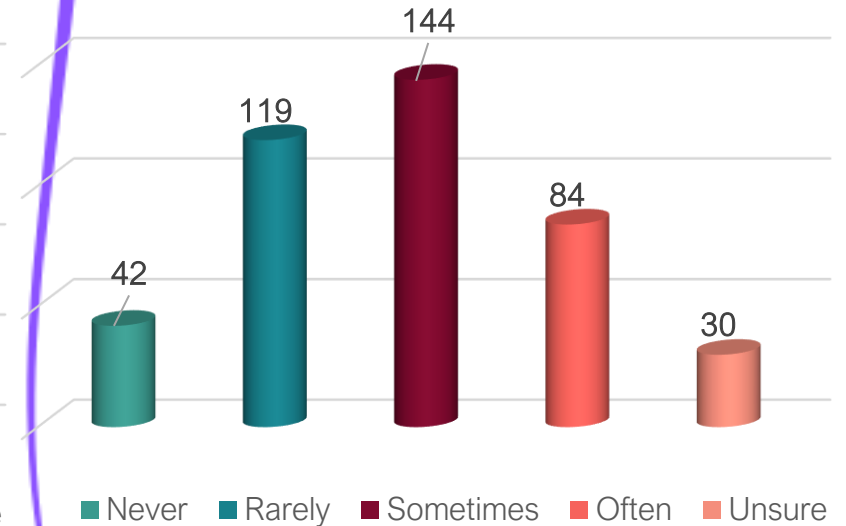

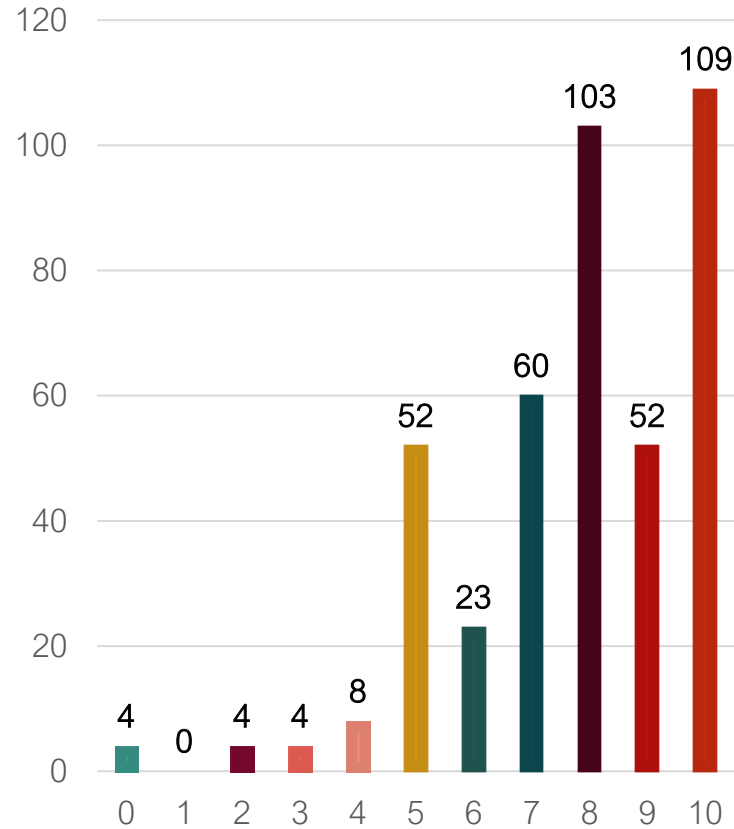

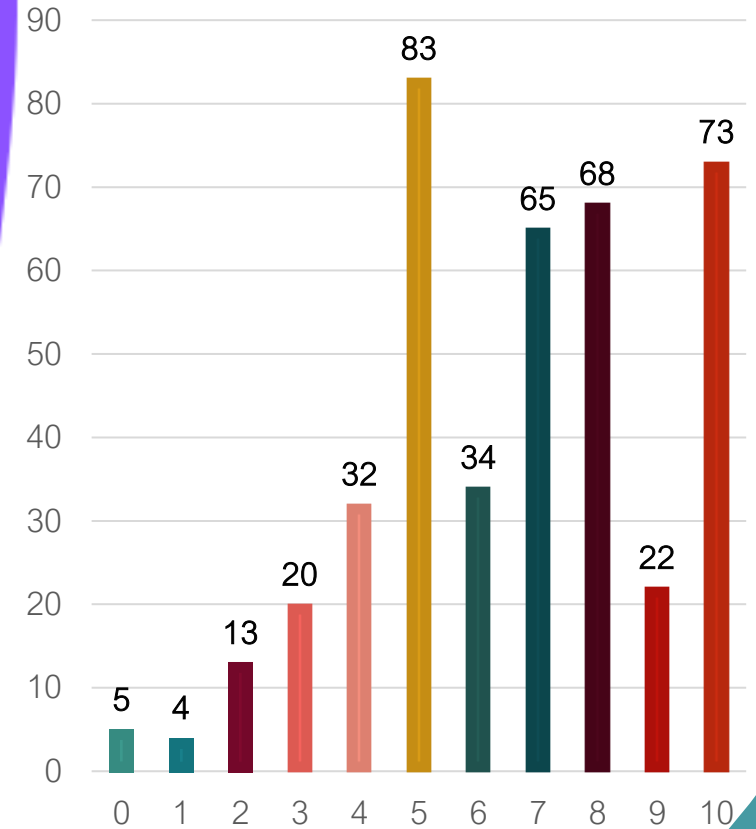
- On a scale of unfavourable to favourable - How do you feel about people from the Catholic community?

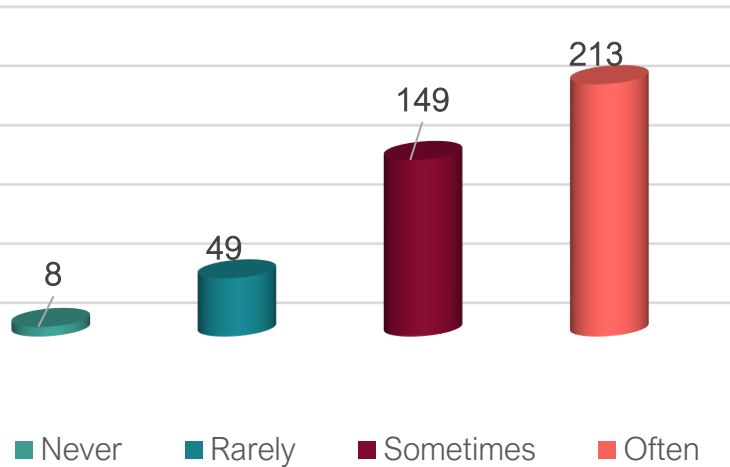

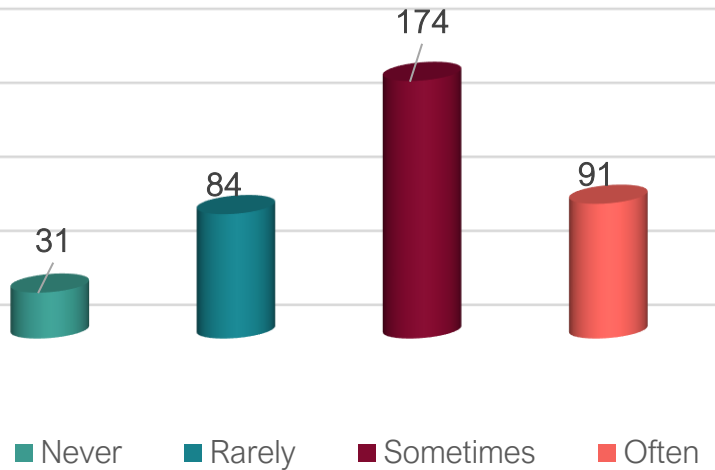

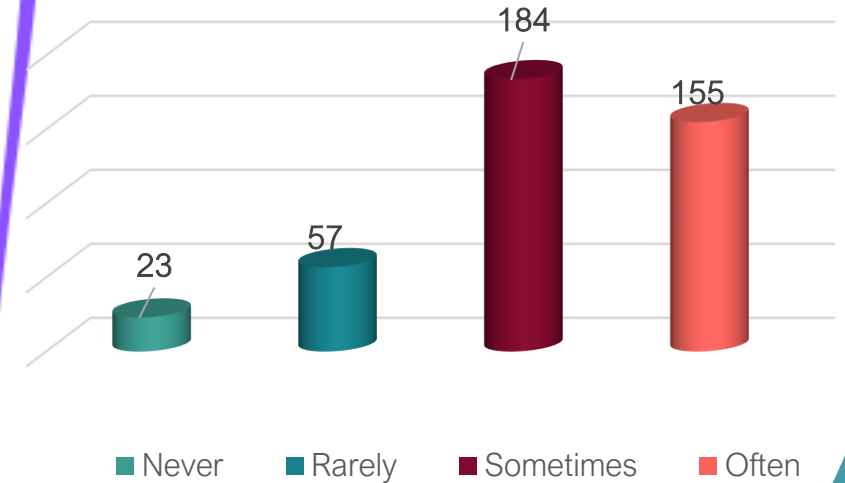

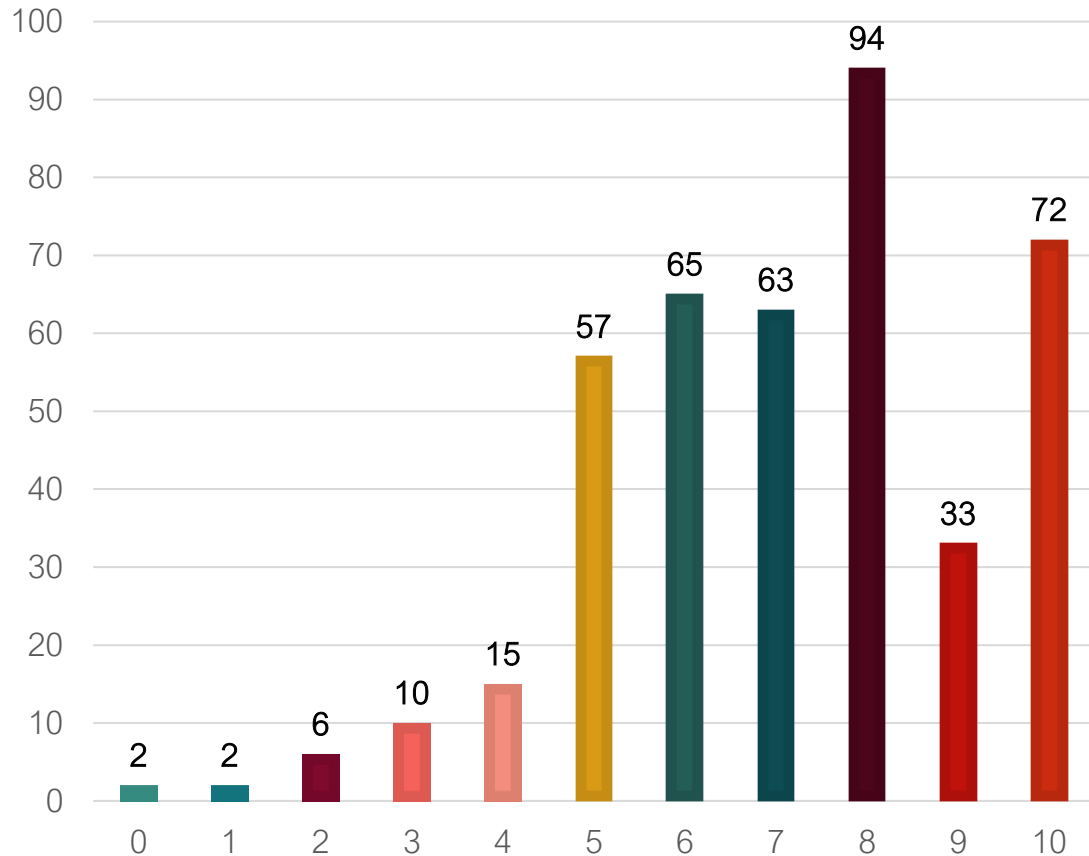

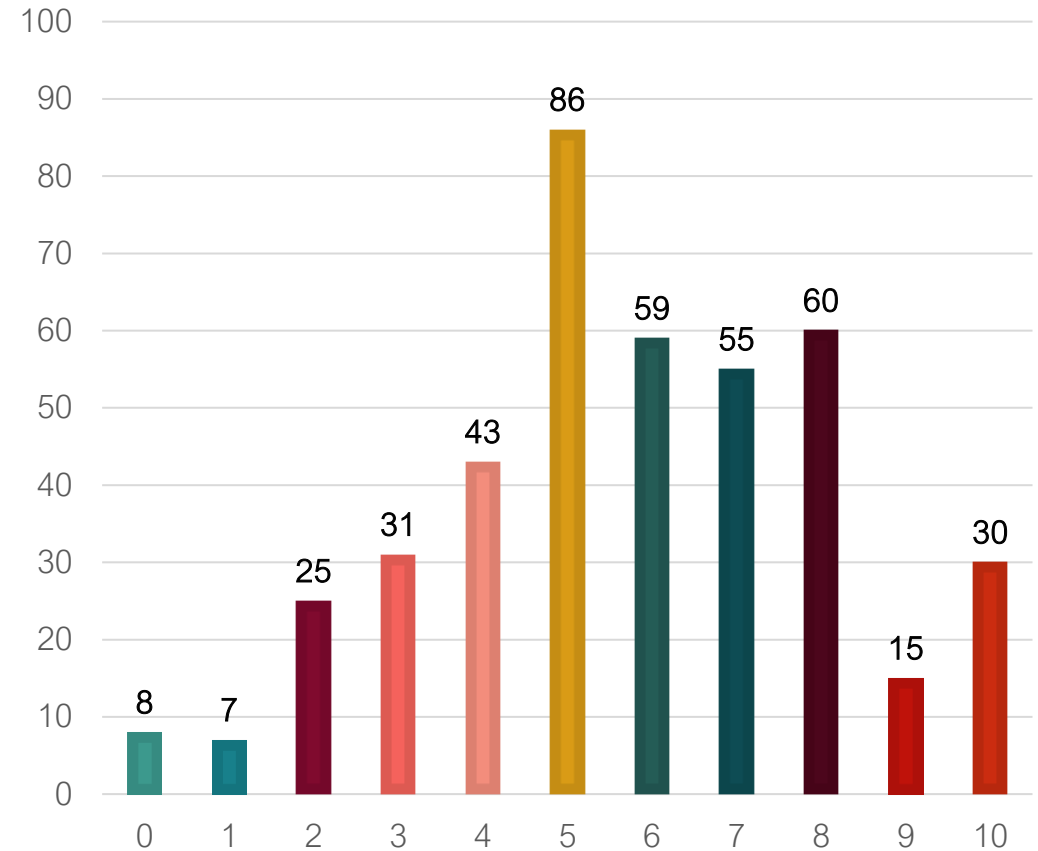

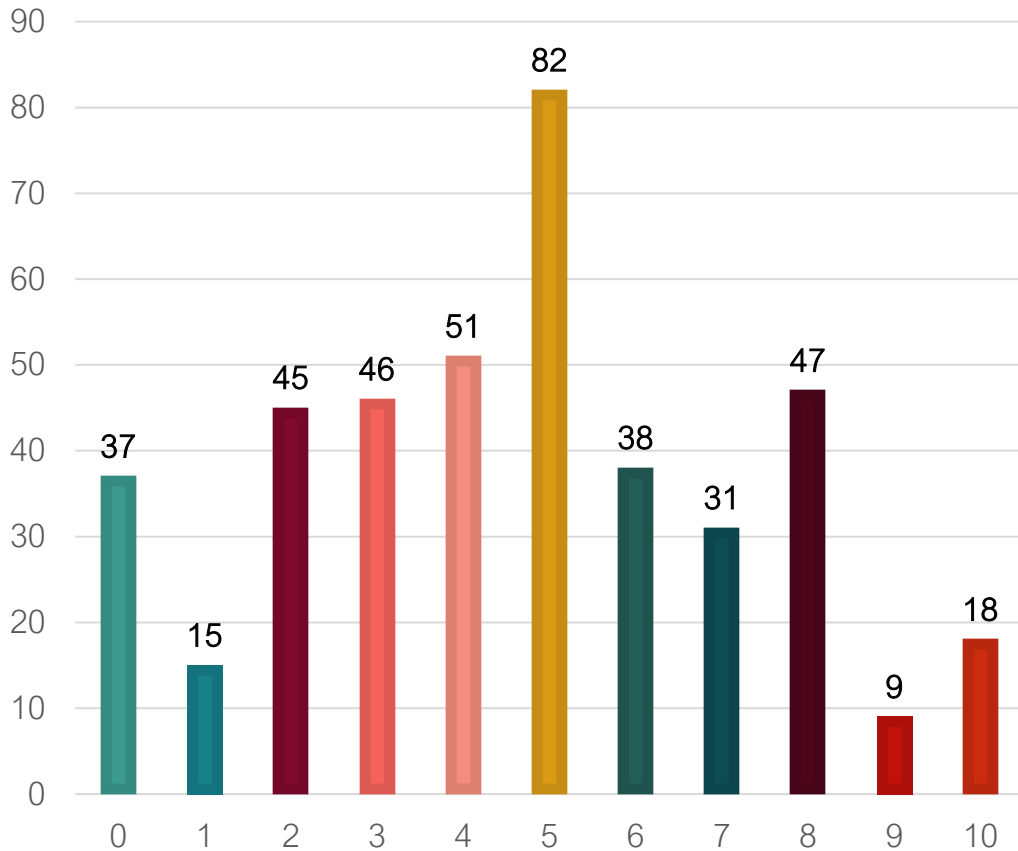

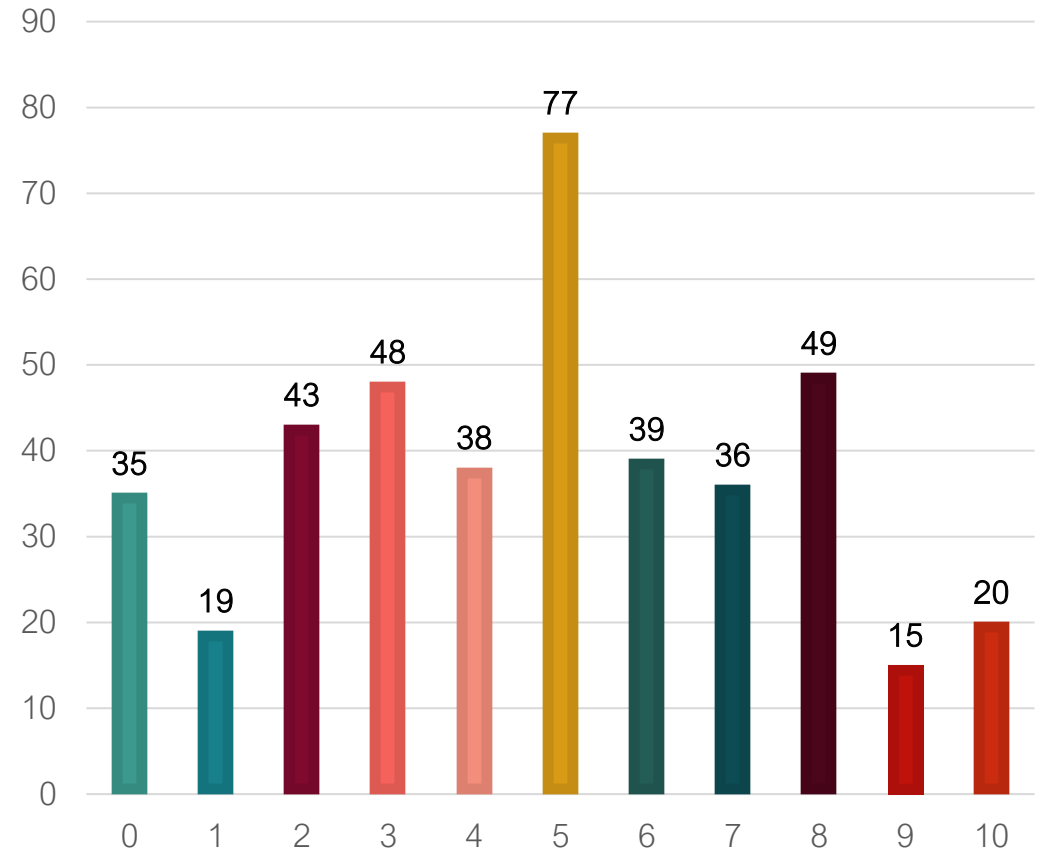

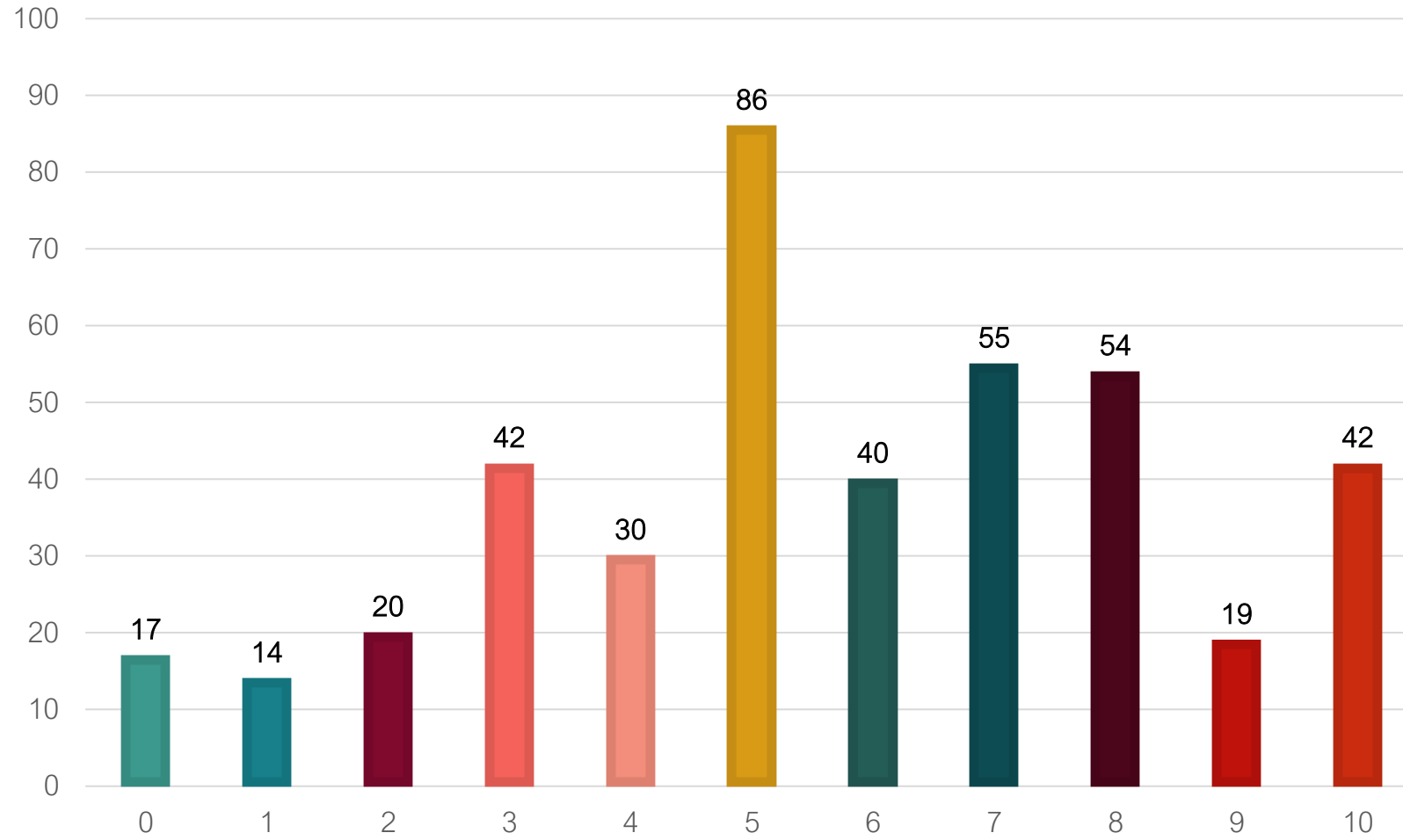

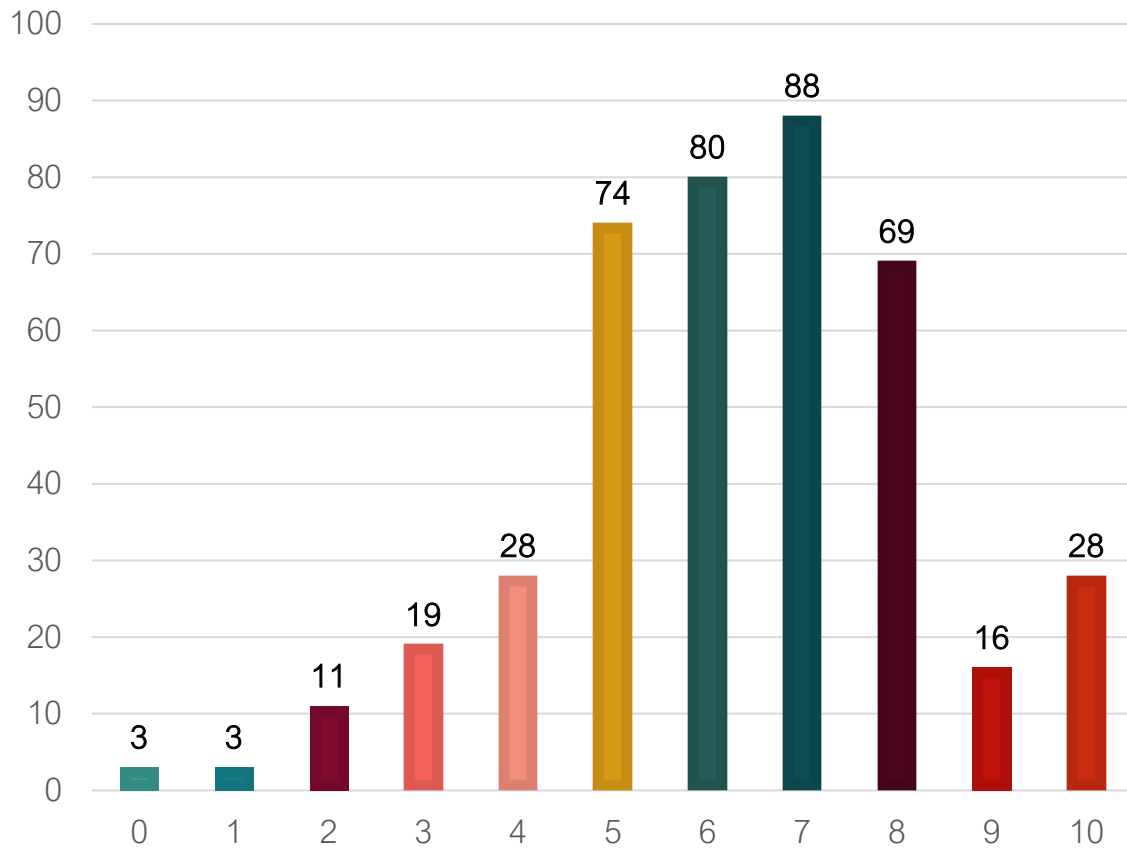

- How confident do you currently feel in encouraging others to be more supportive of diversity and reconciliation?



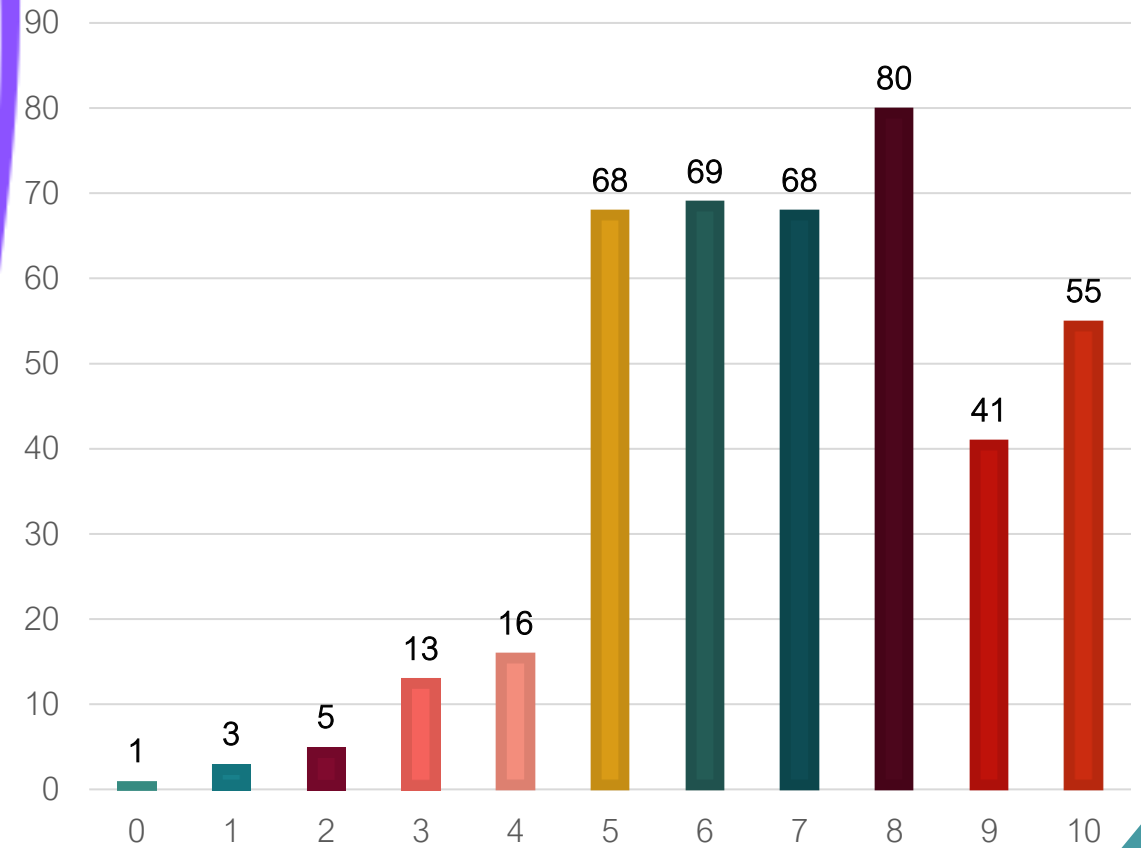
## Question 36:

- How safe and welcoming do you personally feel local villages, towns and urban areas are for you?

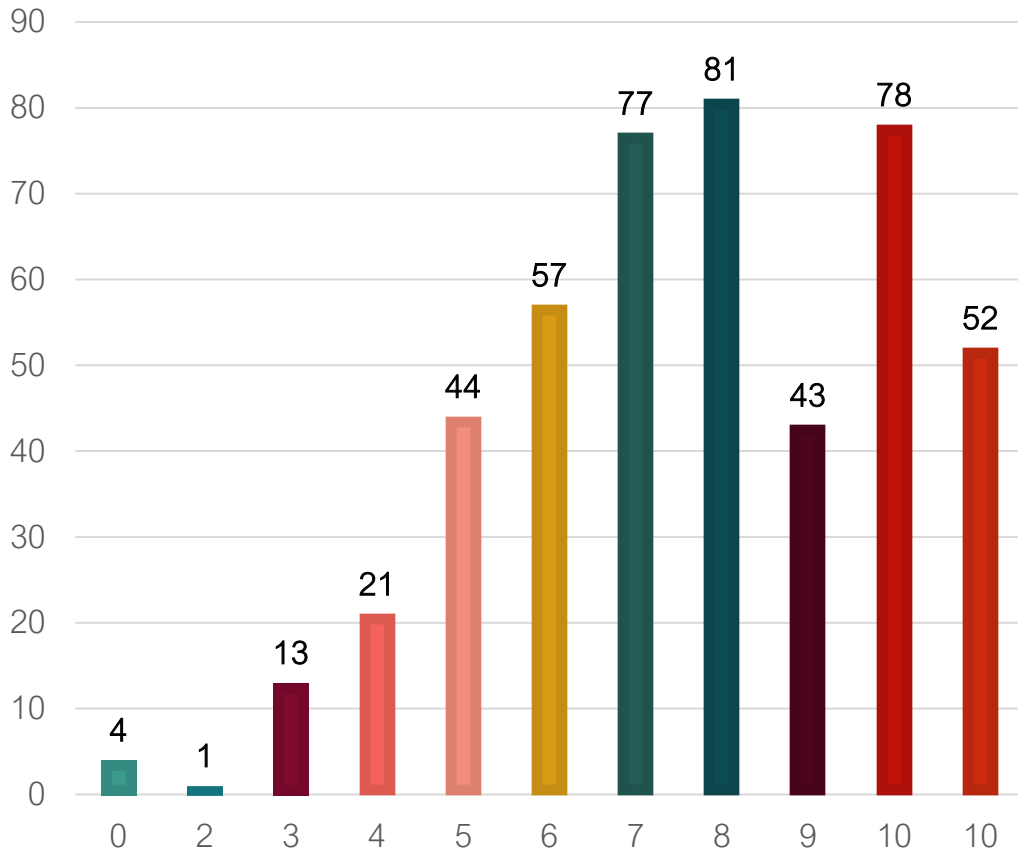

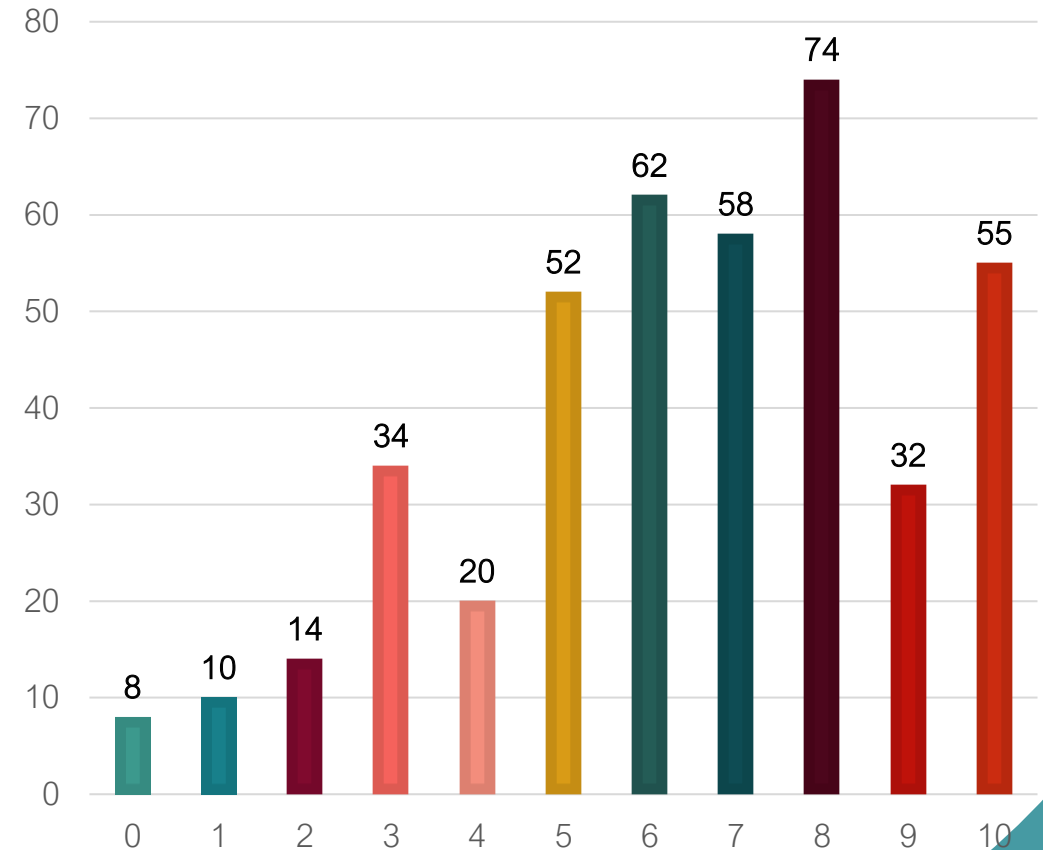

Now we have many different kinds of people arriving in Northern Ireland and we are ignorant to their beliefs and probably apprehensive of getting to know them and their background.

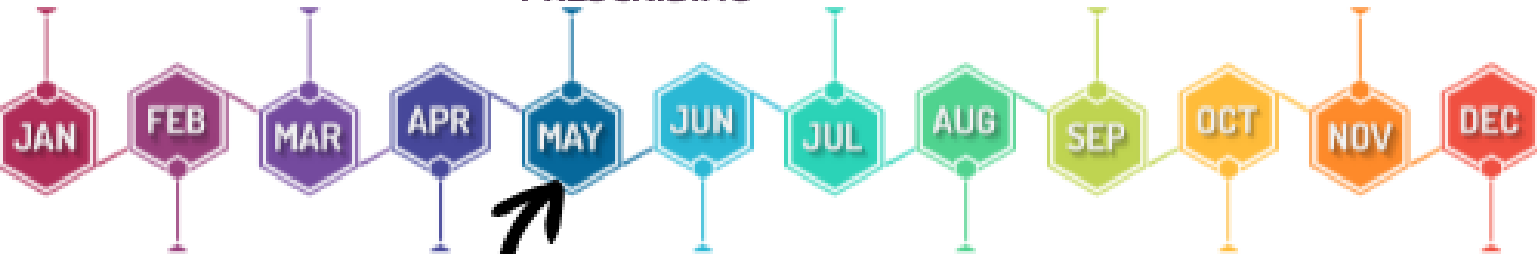
