The Causeway Coast and Glens Borough stretches from Lough Foyle in the west to the Glens of Antrim in the east and the main towns are Coleraine, Ballymoney, Ballycastle and Limavady. It is home to the Giant's Causeway World Heritage Site, along with a host of other visitor attractions.

Causeway Coast and Glens Borough Council provides a range of local services. There are foodbanks in Coleraine, Limavady, Ballymoney and Ballycastle. If you are struggling to be able to afford food, churches and health professionals can provide you with a foodbank voucher that will provide balanced and nutritional meals for 3 days. You can also contact the foodbank directly.

There are also two social supermarkets where you can access food at a very reduced rate for a period of 12 weeks if you sign up to participate in a money management and advice programme.

If you need help with other emergency essentials like toiletries and hygiene products, nappies and other baby items most of the local foodbanks will be able to provide you with assistance.
