1.0 Purpose of Report

The purpose of this report is to present the outcome of the assessment of applications received to the Ending Violence Against Women and Girls Change Fund 2025-26 for approval.

2.0 Background

- 2.1 As per the report presented to the Leisure and Development Committee on the 17th December 2024, Council can avail of up to £90,000 of grant funding for the 2025/26 allocation of the Ending Violence Against Women and Girls Change Fund (funding programme).
- 2.2 Following mandatory information sessions, the Ending Violence Against Women and Girls grant programme was opened for applications on 10th March 2025 with a closing date of Friday 28th March 2025. Council facilitated 3 information sessions to potential applicant groups across the borough. A link to apply to the grant was sent to all groups who had attended the information sessions. Groups could apply for funds from 1 of 3 tiers:
 - Tier 1 up to £5000;
 - Tier 2 Between £5001- £15,000;
 - Tier 3 Between £15,001- £25,000.

3.0 Applications Received

3.1 Applications were received from 13 organisations. An assessment panel of Council Officers assessed the applications received against the criteria as stated in the Guidance Notes for the programme. Applicants were required to attain a score of at least 65% to be recommended for funding, in line with Council's Grant Funding Policy. An extract from the Guidance Notes for the grant programme, detailing assessment criteria, is attached at **Annex A.**

3.2 Out of the 13 applications received 3 did not reach the threshold of 65%. Detailed feedback will be provided to unsuccessful applicant groups. 9 applications have been recommended for funding for a total of £110,925. The amount applied for exceeds the expected budget by £20,925 (19%). The recommended awards for funding have been reduced accordingly to bring these within budget. A list of the successful applications and the grant amount recommended can be found in **Annex A**.

4.0 Recommendation

It is recommended that Council provide approval to award funding to 9 organisations totalling £89,849.25 through the Ending Violence Against Women and Girls Change Fund 2025-26 as noted in **Annex A**.
