1.0 Purpose of Report

The purpose of this report is to seek Elected Members approval for the delivery of the schedule of Council-led Tourism Event programme for 2026/27 (i.e. tourism events directly organised and delivered by Causeway Coast and Glens Borough Council).

2.0 Background

- 2.1 The Council's 10-year strategic approach for the Tourism Event remit recommends that the Council need to provide a balanced approach to event development, facilitation, and delivery. With an increasing number of external event providers, the role of Council is more important than ever in terms of being supportive and allowing other event providers to develop the sector. The strategic approach recognises that Council will still be an event provider but recommends that to achieve a balance, Council delivered events should be fewer, better resourced and promoted more effectively. The 10-year strategic approach for Tourism Events was approved by Council in 2021. The recommendations from the strategic review of Tourism Events will be reviewed as part of the ongoing process to develop the Council's Destination Management Strategy for 2026-2036.
- 2.2 The Armed Forces Day in Northern Ireland will be hosted in Coleraine on Saturday 20th
 June 2026 and Causeway Coast and Glens Borough Council will play a key delivery
 role as the event organiser along with partner MOD agencies to ensure that this event
 is a success. The Tourism Events team will be required to assist with strategic and
 operational planning for this Corporate led event.
- 2.3 During the 2025/26 year the Council's Tourism Events team delivered on the agreed programme of events and played a supporting role in the delivery of The 153rd Open Championship after returning for the second time within a six year period.
- 2.4 For Elected Members information, the Tourism Events team was shortlisted in November 2025 for the National Outdoor Events Association's "Best Council Events Team" award, recognising their excellence in delivering quality UK outdoor events and the benefit they bring to the visitor economy.

3.0 Proposed Council Events for 2026/2027

- 3.1 A summary of the dates and costs for each of the proposed Council-led events, based on the events schedule agreed in previous years by Elected Members, is shown in **Table 1** below. Further detail on each of the events is provided in **Annex A.**
- 3.2 Officers have made an assessment of the costs based on the requirements to deliver these events in 2025 with an uplift for 2026/27 due to the impact of inflationary pressures. (*The Consumer Price Index (CPI) has increased by 3.6% in the 12 months to Oct 25*). Headroom within budgets for the 2025-2026 period has been challenging and Officers have set the uplift for the 2026/27 budget at 4% on top of the current year's budget due in part to above inflation costs for crowd and traffic management and programme improvements from lessons learned this year. It is hoped that efficiencies can be achieved where possible. Additional costs required for programme delivery in 2026/27 have been detailed in **Table 1**.

4.0 **Budgetary Position**

- 4.1 In advance of the 2026 rate setting process, the Leisure and Development Committee is asked to consider the budget allocation for the delivery of Council led events (as detailed in **Table 1**).
- 4.2 The delivery of the proposed Tourism Event programme requires significant procurement, with numerous procurement exercises taking place throughout the year. Officers are requesting that, subject to adhering to Council's procurement guidelines, approval is given for the total expenditure as detailed in **Table 1**, and rather than seeking individual procurement exercise approvals, Officers be enabled to tender and

spend up to the maximum detailed per event as shown in Table 1, with future reports presented to Committee as required confirming expenditure details.

5.0 Recommendations

It is recommended that the Leisure and Development Committee approves the proposed schedule of activity for Council-led Tourism Events 2026/27 as detailed within the report:

The approach outlined for the delivery of Council led events as detailed in **Table 1** and **Annex A**, at a cost not to exceed £626,693, and subject to the Council rates setting process for 2026-27.

Ballymoney Spring Fair - Fri 17th & Sat 18th April

Ballymoney Spring Fair is an annual event held in April each year to animate the town, support the local businesses/community and to attract visitors to the town. Traditionally this event is organised by the Council's Tourism Events Team supported by Ballymoney Chamber of Commerce and Fuse FM, to include family entertainment to promote visitor and community participation where possible. The theme of the fair is aligned to the family fun segmentation of Tourism Events.

Friday of the Fair takes place at Castlecroft and consists of live music, Fuse radio and an artisan market. There is also a tea dance at the Town Hall.

Saturday has several aspects to the event over a number of locations, including Quiet Time, Vintage vehicle display, live music, amusements, children's activities, carnival entertainment and stalls within closed roads in the town centre and finishes with a multi-participant parade. The event typically attracts 3,000 - 5,000 visitors across the various event activities.

NW200 Race Week Festival – Mon 4th - Sat 9th May

As part of North West 200 Race Week Festival, Causeway Coast and Glens BC, in conjunction with Coleraine and District Motor Club, stage Meet the Riders at the Event Space in Coleraine Town Centre on the Friday. This is a free, no-ticket event giving the public an opportunity to meet the riders and personalities at that year's NW200.

A NW200 Firework Display is held on the Friday of Race Week, at The Crescent, Portstewart. Entertainment will be live music at the Witches' Hat Band stand followed by the Firework Display from Atlantic Circle. Historically a crowd of between 3000 - 5000 is expected depending on the weather.

On the back of the 2025 success of the first ever NW200 Beach Race, Council and the organisers of this element are once again working towards a similar showcase as part of the race week programme.

NB: Tourism and Recreation Officers in conjunction with Environmental Services are investigating impacts of firework on livestock and domestic pets.

Rathlin Sound Festival

Rathlin Sound Festival celebrates the local heritage through community organised events featuring music, song, talks, exhibitions, workshops and storytelling.

For 2026, the emphasis will feature a celebration of the Causeway Coast and Glens culture and music, with an enhanced music and song programme with live gigs and folk sessions throughout Ballycastle's participating host venues, to attract visitors to stay longer and benefit the nighttime economy.

Rathlin Island will continue to promote its unique island heritage through authentic maritime adventures and vibrant community culture, giving visitors the chance to experience the best of the 'Sound', the iconic waters connecting the Island with Ballycastle.

This Council-led event will be delivered with support from Rathlin Development Community Association and other voluntary organisations and external bodies. For 2026 the main themes will be:

- Island life
- Maritime heritage through storytelling
- Food and drink
- Music and cultural connections

Ould Lammas Fair – Sat 22nd – Tues 25th August

The Ould Lammas Fair is Ireland's oldest recorded fair dating back for hundreds of years. This event takes place on the last Monday and Tuesday in August each year. The weekend has now been extended to a four-day event for all to enjoy. The fair takes place in the beautiful seaside town of Ballycastle with traders lining the streets, selling traditional items, homemade arts & craft, food and more.

The agricultural element takes place on Fairhill Street just off The Diamond in Ballycastle and includes horse trading, farrier displays, pony rides and an animal petting farm. The event attracts hundreds of thousands to the town with many family members returning for this nostalgic event. There are new additions to the fair that have been added to, including family fun entertainment, live music and Agri zones.

The event typically attracts up to 130,000 visitors at various activities over the 4 days.

This revitalised event will showcase the area's food and drink sectors including artisan suppliers and small-batch beverage producers, bringing together the rich flavours and heritage that defines Causeway Coast and Glens food and drink offerings.

As October unfolds, the festival will serve as the official launchpad for a month of curated food and drink experiences across the borough. Visitors will be invited to explore the stories, skills, and traditions behind local produce, discovering a place where quality ingredients, skilled craftsmanship, and cultural heritage are at the heart of every bite and sip.

Attracting around 5,000 visitors, the Bushmills Salmon & Whiskey Festival draws passionate food and drink enthusiasts eager to immerse themselves in local craftsmanship, authentic produce, and the warm hospitality that defines the destination.

Halloween Happenings brings some spooky themes into the local towns of the Borough. These include parades, spooky characters, fire poi, live music, amusements, spooky trails and fireworks. These events are organised by Council and local voluntary organisations. Each event attracts over 4,000 visitors.

Ballymoney's Halloween venue will require a site capability assessment moving forward. The popularity of the event has proven difficult to weatherproof within the current site at Ballymoney Showgrounds which is agricultural lands with poor ground conditions. Council Officers will therefore reevaluate all other potential venues for an appropriate firing point and event space within the Joey Dunlop Leisure Centre grounds.


Causeway Coast and Glens Borough Council and Ulster University (UU) have built a positive working relationship having delivered successful Halloween events since 2023. Council hope to further enhance the partnership with UU as this venue is central to many attendees throughout the borough, therefore able to provide for a higher visitor demand. The size and scale of the site, enables the Events Team to accommodate large numbers, both as an entertainment site and cater for an effective traffic & transport plan. This also includes a Park & Ride Service from Coleraine town centre.

The Limavady Halloween event has continuously increased in visitor numbers over the last number of years, therefore careful event programming is required that appeals to the public and that is in fitting with the current event site constraints.

The Ballycastle Halloween event will remain unchanged at Ballycastle Seafront and will require access to the Marina Car Park and Pier to assist with the event footprint.
