As a deeply concerned resident of the Causeway Coast and Glens Council area, I am writing to you again, asking you to defend the interests of local people and to protect our natural environment.

I object in the strongest terms to the proposed construction of this wind farm. My concerns relate to associated health issues within the community, both physical and mental, from potential contamination of air and water, e.g. radiation, pollution including noise pollution, the threat to the local ecosystem.

The negative, visual impact of such turbines within the Sperrin National Landscape, of which Benbradagh is recognised as a prominent feature, is also of great concern – heartbreaking really, to think of what’s to become of this historic and beautiful mountain.

I am also concerned about the change of use of this agricultural land to facilitate such a wind farm.

I therefore strongly urge you to vote against this planning application.
