The Mayor opened the meeting and provided guidance in relation to the audio recording of the meeting.

1. APOLOGIES

2. OUTGOING MAYOR'S ADDRESS

Outgoing Mayor, Councillor McQuillan addressed Council:

"Well, as I bring my term as Mayor to a close this evening, I want to begin by saying what an immense privilege it has been to serve in this role over the past year. It has been an experience I will carry with me for the rest of my life.

When I was given the chance to take up Office, we set out with a clear goal: to amplify the voices and achievements of our young people right across the Causeway Coast and Glens council area. I've had the honour of hosting countless receptions recognising their sporting triumphs, artistic talents, and contributions to community life. It has been a constant reminder of the potential that exists in our council area and of the responsibility we all share to support and nurture it.

But I also felt strongly that we couldn't ignore the struggles our young people face — especially around mental health. That's why I was particularly proud of the focus placed on this issue throughout the year, including events like the Men's Mental Health Night in Dunloy in November, which brought together voices and experiences that deserve to be heard.

Visiting our local secondary schools gave me insight into the concerns, hopes, and frustrations of a generation that wants to see real change. It reaffirmed for me just how important it is that their views are reflected in the work we do.

Throughout this year, I've also made it my aim to represent every corner of our council area, and to celebrate the diversity and strength of all our communities. From the coastlines of Rathlin to rural towns and villages, I've been proud to engage with individuals and groups working day in and day out to make life better for others.

Together with the Deputy Mayor, we raised over £5,000 this year for two exceptional charities — MindWise and NIKPA — causes that do vital work for people across the North of Ireland. I want to put on record my sincere thanks to the Deputy Mayor — not just for your partnership in those efforts, but for your constant support throughout the year: from organising events and standing in for me at receptions, to the occasional reminder to straighten my tie before a photo! Your help, good humour, and reliability have been greatly appreciated.

I also want to take a moment to thank the council staff, who have guided and supported me every step of the way. Their professionalism and commitment often go unseen, but they are the backbone of what we do. In particular, I want to express heartfelt thanks to Eithne in the Mayor's Office

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— your advice, organisation, and support have been outstanding, and I truly would have been lost without you.

I would also like to thank my family for continued support throughout the year especially regarding the charity coffee morning. I wouldn't have been able to do it without their support.

To my party colleagues, thank you once again for the trust you placed in me. This opportunity has been life changing, and I hope I have done it justice.

It's been a significant year for this council area. We've seen the reinstatement of the £110 million Growth Deal and the Launch of the Co-Designed local community PeacePlus Action Plan. We've hosted fantastic events like the first ever Red Bull Cliff Diving competition, the North West 200, the incredibly moving Joey 25 celebration in Ballymoney, the historic Lammas Fair and many more.

We've also been privileged to welcome countless visitors to our council area throughout the year — from near and far — helping to showcase all we have to offer. It was a pleasure to officially open numerous new playparks that will serve our children and families for years to come, and to take part in some truly outstanding seasonal events that brought communities together and created lasting memories.

And what has stood out the most for me this year has been the people — the volunteers, business owners, educators and carers who quietly get on with making our council area better. Travelling across the Causeway Coast and Glens and meeting them has been a genuine privilege.

Finally, thank you to all members for your cooperation this year and your continued support. It has been an honour to work alongside you all."

3. OUTGOING DEPUTY MAYOR'S ADDRESS

Outgoing Deputy Mayor, Councillor Stirling addressed Council,

"It has been an honour to serve as the Borough's Deputy Mayor. This year has been truly incredible. The role has given me the opportunity to meet people in every corner of the borough, individuals working tirelessly to provide vital services such as mental health support, food banks, Veterans' projects, to name but a few, and the opportunity to visit schools, youth groups, girls' brigades and scouting groups. Their dedication and passion are truly inspiring.

There have been many highlights, including the Royal Visit and meeting King Charles, and I must admit, conversing with King Charles is beyond my

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wildest expectation for this role in September. Despite the weather not being kind on the Sunday, the Air Show on the Saturday was absolutely spectacular. Meeting Army personnel and Service women and men who have served was one of the most humbling experience of my year. Their stories of bravery and sacrifice are unforgettable. The Christmas events calendar, of course, was packed and a real pleasure to attend, and I'd be available this year again, should anybody need me in the back of a sleigh. This year the Northwest 200 was a definite highlight and this event was certainly one of the best that I've ever been to. The recent Joey 25 event in Ballymoney was incredible and a credit to everybody involved. I had the honour of hosting many receptions for sporting groups of all ages, community groups borough wide and recognising groups and individuals who have achieved great things, meeting so many wonderful people who have selflessly given their time and expertise to the success of these groups, amongst them hosting 106 year old Norman Irwin, an incredible individual with a remarkable life, was a distinct pleasure. His stories and wisdom are something that I will cherish forever.

Thank you to the members of my Council Group for affording me the opportunity to carry out this role, your support has been invaluable. Thank you to my family for their unwavering support and patience, without you, none of this would be possible. Thank you of course, to Ethne for ensuring that I was where I was supposed to be, even if I wasn't very sure myself. Thank you to the endless Council staff for their guidance and their patience.

Thank you, Mayor, for your generosity and the opportunity to attend so many great events throughout the borough and I'd like to take this opportunity to wish the incoming Mayor and Deputy Mayor a successful year ahead. Thank you".

Councillor McShane addressed Council

"Well done to both Ciarán and Tanya for your work throughout the year. First of all, on behalf of the Sinn Féin group I would like to thank you both, you had a great working relationship. I don't think in all the years that I've been in Council, I think it's 20, just past, I don't think I heard a raised voice in the 12 months that the meetings were chaired and very professionally done so and very fair and very transparent. And I don't know whether this maybe helps as well, you're the youngest Mayor I think ever on the island of Ireland and maybe just not having any kind of baggage as well it has been great just to have that kind of fresh approach, and I suppose maybe just turning a blind eye when you had to for maybe older seasoned ones just when it was needed and to keep that calm effect, it's been really welcomed.

I know you mentioned a number of those activities that took place and I think that's the first time we've seen a video of a collage of photographs to sum up the year and I think that was really nice to see and a great reminder

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of the very challenging role for the Mayor and the Deputy Mayor, but when you work together, it definitely makes the role so much easier.

A number of those activities, that I saw, and particularly in The Glens and you mentioned it was the Cliff Diving the first time it was taken place in our Council area and in particular for Ballycastle was absolutely brilliant for the area in July last year. And also the cutting of the sod for the new Ballycastle Leisure Centre on Quay Road earlier this year, it was also brilliant and sharing in the Olympic success for Coleraine Rowing Club, for the Joey Dunlop event last weekend and also the launch of the Peace Plus Action Plan and, not least, the £110 million Growth Deal Heads of Terms that were also signed within your Term.

I know on a personal level, it's a great privilege for you and for your family, but also for our party. You have held yourself in such dignity throughout the year and also to see that photograph of your niece, who was also born in the last year and then with her in the chair and having the chains last weekend was a lovely personal touch. So thank you both very much and wishing the Incoming, Mayor and Deputy Mayor, all the best".

Councillor MA McKillop addressed Council

However, we hope you have enjoyed your year meeting the many constituent's at events across the borough and wish you well.

Re: Council Members Representation to The Reserve Forces and Cadets Association, Northern Ireland

Traditionally, RFCA NI, has been provided with one Council Member Representative who would have a dual role as the Veterans Champion (VC). However in June 2023 after consultation with the NI Veterans Support Office (as was) and the VCs, they agreed that the VC would benefit from having a Deputy. The funding from the Armed Forces Covenant Fund Trust has resulted in a significant rise in the VCs profile and veteran community engagement. The nomination of a Deputy VC could provide great outreach within the constituency and help the VC with the increased workload generated from within the veterans' community.

Although mandated to provide one representative, I would be very grateful if you could consider the additional request.
