NI EXECUTIVE'S RESPONSE TO THE COVID-19 INQUIRY MODULE 1 REPORT

The UK Covid-19 Inquiry is an independent public inquiry into the UK's response to and the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic. Baroness Heather Hallett, the Chair to the UK Covid-19 Inquiry, launched the inquiry in July 2022.

As you may be aware, the UK Covid-19 Inquiry published its first report on Module 1 (Resilience and Preparedness) on 18 July 2024, which made 10 key recommendations Module 1 Report - The resilience and preparedness of the United Kingdom - UK Covid-19 Inquiry. Following agreement at the Executive meeting on 9 January 2025, the Executive approved publication of its Response to the UK Covid Inquiry Module 1 Report - Executive Response to the COVID-19 Module 1 Report Jan 2025 | The Executive Office.

Work is underway on implementing actions to address the recommendations. We are committed to ensuring that these actions align with the needs and expectations of all involved parties and recognise the invaluable role that you can play in this process.
