School Children in the Borough become Streetwise!

During May and June of this year officers from the Health and Build Environment section of Causeway Coast and Glens Borough Council organised Streetwise events in partnership with a range of other agencies.

Over the 9 day period 988 primary school children from 45 schools across the Borough attended events in Limavady, Coleraine, Ballymoney and Ballycastle to be educated on the dangers that they may face in everyday life. Teaching was carried out in an interactive manner with opportunities for the children to have hands on experience of what to do in case of emergency.

Streetwise is an educational initiative to promote safety and develop personal and community awareness to prepare pupils for the transition to secondary level education. The programme aims to educate pupils to become more aware of their personal safety, home safety to avoid becoming victims of crime and to foster responsible citizenship and foster better relations with statutory agencies. Other scenarios include recycling, protecting the environment, electrical safety, bike/fire and bus safety, including information on beach safety to name but a few.
