## 1. THE MAYOR'S BUSINESS

The Mayor addressed the meeting as follows:

'Good evening everyone and welcome to our monthly meeting. I hope you all have had a chance to enjoy the recent sunshine and warm weather.

We've had a busy and successful start to the summer season, with the Irish Open attracting thousands of people to Portstewart and the surrounding areas. It was a huge success for the Borough – and the feedback I have received reflects this. During the event I attended a dinner hosted by Invest NI at Harry's Shack, and on the final day I took part in the prize-giving ceremony which is certainly an early highlight of my term as Mayor. With millions of people watching around the world, our destination was showcased to a global audience. I would like to thank our staff most sincerely and pay tribute to the Chief Executive and staff who worked so hard and diligently to deliver what was indeed a quality event in the Borough. Thank you, Chief Executive, and thank you to your staff for their efforts in this.

And staying with a golfing theme, last week I was part of a Council delegation which travelled to Royal Birkdale in Southport to witness The Open as we countdown to its return to Portrush in 2019. The visit gave us a sense of the sheer scale of the event, and the organisational logistics behind it. It was invaluable to hear from our counterparts in Sefton Council about their experiences this year, as well as representatives from Carnoustie in Scotland where the event will be held next year. It is clear that staging The Open in Portrush will have an invaluable impact on our Borough, and this will have a legacy well beyond 2019.

This month really will be remembered for sporting events, as on Sunday evening I took part in the annual Super Cup NI parade here in Coleraine. I'm delighted to say the weather was on our side, making it a fantastic spectacle for all participants as well as the gathered spectators. This morning I hosted a small reception for a delegation from China and from Chile, this highlights the International aspect of the game.

Since the tournament's beginning, local councils have been involved through sponsorship and I am proud that Causeway Coast and Glens Borough Council continues to offer its support to an event which celebrates youth football at its very best. My best wishes go to all teams involved.

This afternoon I had the honour of unveiling a plaque where we celebrated a major swimming achievement which took place in 1929 when Mercedes Gleitze swam from Moville to Portstewart, this swim was repeated last year when Heather Clatworthy from Portstewart completed the swim again, we also remembered the fishermen in Portstewart who are also very important to the economy there.

Looking ahead to this weekend, the annual Race of Legends returns to Armoy. I'm sure many of us here have heard stories of the Armoy Armada, and this event reminds us all of the legacy of those famous racers who now inspire a new generation. I'm looking forward to attending the racing on Saturday, and I hope it's an enjoyable and safe event for all.

I would like to send my congratulations to the Loughgiel School of Irish Dancing which made history when they were awarded 100/100 in the Open Floor Dance competition in North Wales. This was the first time that any group received full marks in the 70 year history of the International Eisteddfod.

I would also like to commend the organisers of the Red Sails Festival in Portstewart which takes place this week. My thanks go to all involved in organising this very popular event, which is a fantastic example of partnership working. I hope it is another successful event for the resort.

Finally, I would like to add my congratulations to Dunloy Accordion Band who won Best Band on Parade at The Royal 13<sup>th</sup> Scarva who were delighted and proud to bring a Trophy back to Borough.
