# 1.0 Background

This matter relates to a complaint originally received on the 1<sup>st</sup> September 2013. Following a protracted investigation the legacy Council had taken a decision taken to instigate legal proceedings against the landowner for failure to comply with the requirements of the remedial notice under Section 10(1) of the High Hedges Act (Northern Ireland) 2011.

The notice was served on the 17<sup>th</sup> October 2014 and expired on the 17<sup>th</sup> January 2015. The accompanying correspondence to the notice included details of the right of appeal, which in this case was 28 days expiring on the 17<sup>th</sup> November 2014. An appeal to the Northern Ireland Valuation Tribunal was made on the 12<sup>th</sup> May 2015. The solicitor for the appellant has given the reason for delay in submission of the appeal as their client was medically unfit to deal with legal issues. The Northern Ireland Valuation Tribunal has written to Council giving the opportunity to express consent or to oppose time being extended in this case.

## 1.2 Recommendation

It is recommended that a response be made to the Northern Ireland Valuation Tribunal opposing the time being extended in this case.
