The transitional scheme was agreed by the EA Board on 30<sup>th</sup> April 2015 following establishment of the Education Authority on 1<sup>st</sup> April 2015, with the agreement that an ‘enduring’ scheme would be developed, consulted on and approved in order that it would be available for all controlled schools for the peak teaching recruitment period in the spring of 2016.</p> <p><b>Scheme for the Management of Controlled Schools</b> The Education Authority has prepared a draft <b>Scheme for the Management of Controlled Schools</b>; which, once agreed, will replace the Transitional Scheme for the Management of Controlled Schools.
